



Using Cautious Language in IELTS Writing

What's This About?

This grammar pack focuses on controlling tone in IELTS essays through cautious language. Many students overuse absolute statements like 'everyone agrees' or 'it is clear that', which can make arguments sound too forceful or unbalanced. Band 7+ writing uses hedging—words and phrases that soften or qualify strong opinions. These include modal verbs (might, could, would) and adverbs like 'often', 'arguably', and 'in some cases'.

IELTS Scoring Impact

Overly strong tone can hurt your score in Task Response (TR) by making your writing seem one-sided or dogmatic. It also affects Lexical Resource (LR) if vocabulary lacks range or flexibility. Band 7+ writing shows the ability to express doubt, suggest likelihood, and leave space for opposing views—skills that cautious language helps demonstrate.

Common Mistakes

- Saying 'everyone agrees' or 'it is obvious' as if no alternative views exist
- Writing 'governments must' without showing that it is an opinion
- Avoiding modal verbs like 'might' or 'could'
- Overusing confident phrases such as 'this proves that' or 'without doubt'
- Using no hedging language at all (e.g., no 'generally', 'often', or 'in most cases')

Rewrite Rules

1. Use modal verbs (might, could, would) to show possibility.
2. Add hedging adverbs: generally, arguably, often, in many cases.
3. Soften strong verbs with qualifiers: 'seems to', 'is believed to', etc.
4. Avoid claiming facts unless you can back them up.
5. Balance opinions with language that allows for alternatives.

Comparison Examples

Too strong: Everyone agrees that homework is essential.

Better: Many people believe that homework is important.

Too strong: It is clear that advertising manipulates people.

Better: It could be argued that advertising influences consumer behavior.

Too strong: Governments must ban fast food.

Better: Governments might consider regulating fast food availability.

Band 5 Example:
